The purpose of the game is to help students determine which ending of s or es would make words plural.

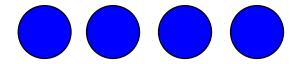
Materials:

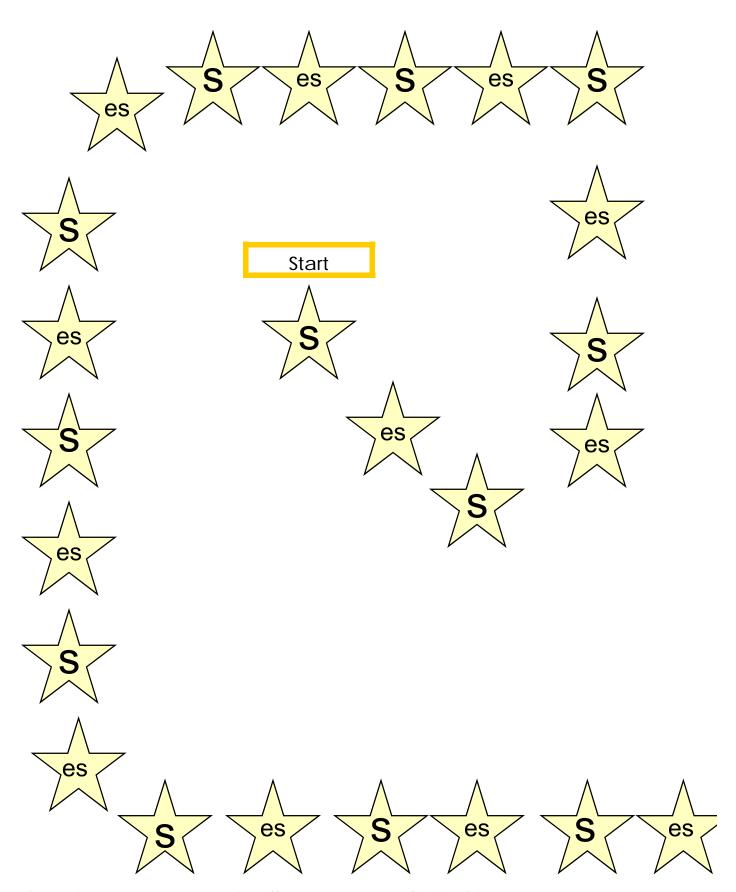
Game board Game markers Word cards

Procedures:

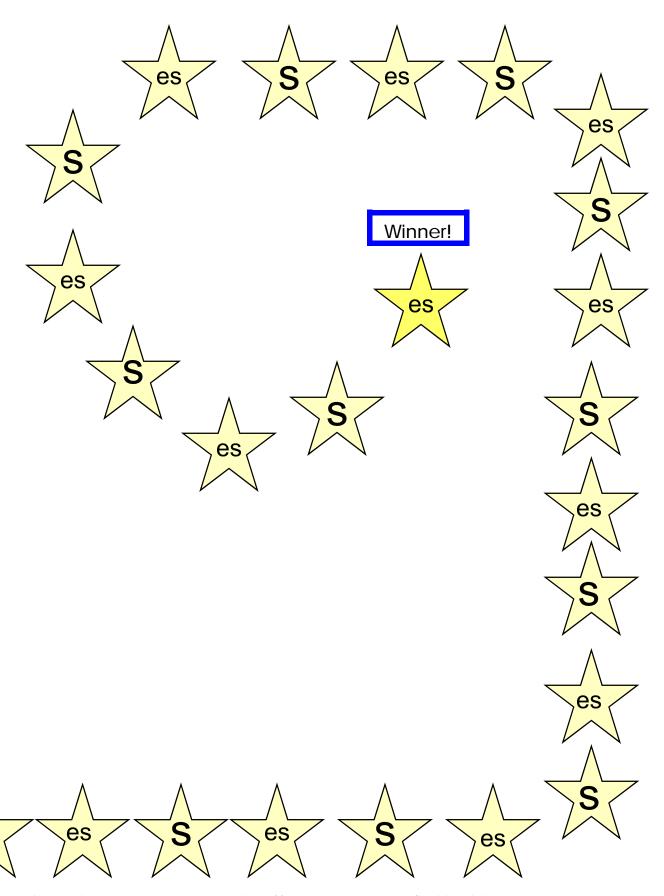
- 1. First student draws card from pile and reads word out loud.
- 2. Student moves his marker to the nearest s or es ending that would make his word plural. If there is a disagreement among players, they should refer to the dictionary.
- 3. If the student draws a penalty or advancement card, he or she will do as it directs.
- 4. The game continues until one player reaches the sizzling star.
